

- The Stena HSS ferries across from the Hoek van Holland in just three hours 40 minutes, alternatively there is the more conventional overnight crossings aboard with cabin accommodation. DFDS (Scandinavian Seaways) has modern ships sailing from

Follow the main A12 road from London to just north of Colchester, take the A120 to Harwich.

From Cambridge you take the A14 straight to Ipswich, then the A45 bypass round Ipswich, the A137 to Manningtree, and from there follow signs to Harwich.

From Norwich you take the A140 to north of Ipswich, then the A45 bypass round Ipswich, the A137 to Manningtree, and from there follow signs to Harwich.

However, if you prefer the short sea crossings from Calais to Dover there is the award-winning seafrance Rodin which is the fastest ferry on the Dover to Calais route. RAIL DIRECTIONS

Trains run from London Liverpool Street station to Harwich International. Local rail services arrive at the terminal building, where an escalator will take you directly to the check in point.

For the more adventurous type who prefers the Channel Tunnel crossing or Eurostar, (the high-speed passenger train operating between the UK and Europe - Le Shuttle 0044 (0) 8705 353535 http://www.eurotunnel.com / Eurostar: 0044 (0) 8705 186186 http://www.eurostar.com) then it is an easy motorway drive up to the East of England/Cambridge via the M20 or M2, M25 and M11.
